

#5 Enhancing Literacy and Numeracy through PYP

In our journey of understanding the Primary Years Programme (PYP), it's essential to explore how this unique framework enhances the development of foundational skills, such as literacy and numeracy, while still aligning seamlessly with the Victorian Curriculum.

At our school, we recognise the crucial role of explicit instruction in teaching these core skills. There is a time and place for direct, focused teaching, particularly when it comes to literacy and numeracy. This ensures that students are equipped with the foundational knowledge and skills they need to navigate through their academic journey.

In the context of the PYP, this explicit instruction is blended with real-life applications, providing an opportunity for students to apply and consolidate their understanding in a variety of contexts. For instance, literacy skills are fostered not just through reading and writing exercises, but also through researching, presenting, and engaging in rich discussions during Units of Inquiry.

Similarly, numeracy is brought to life beyond the traditional mathematics lesson. While explicit instruction provides students with essential mathematical knowledge, the Units of Inquiry give students opportunities to apply mathematical thinking to real-world problems, making connections between maths and other subjects.

By intertwining explicit instruction with inquiry-based learning, the PYP provides an enriched learning environment that enhances the literacy and numeracy skills of our students. And importantly, this approach aligns with the standards and benchmarks of the Victorian Curriculum, ensuring our students are well-equipped and on par with their peers in other Victorian schools.

SUPPORTING THE LEARNER PROFILE AT HOME

Fostering Communication at Home

This week's Learner Profile attribute is "Communicator." Communicators understand and express ideas confidently and creatively in multiple languages and modes of communication. They collaborate effectively and respect the perspectives of others.

Below are some activities that you can take part in with your child/ren to help develop their understanding of being knowledgeable.

- 1.Show and Tell: Encourage your child to share about a favourite toy or book. This fosters verbal communication and listening skills.
- Puppet Play: Create simple puppets and put on a puppet show. This encourages creativity and storytelling.
- 3. Picture Descriptions: Use pictures and ask your child to describe what they see, promoting vocabulary and expression.
- 4. Group Games: Play games that require teamwork, such as a relay race or a group building project.
- 5. Presentation: Encourage your child to prepare a short presentation on a topic of interest to share with the family.
- 6.Pen Pal: Encourage your child to write letters to a family friend, relative, or a pen pal to practice written communication.
- 7.Book Discussion: Discuss a book that your child is reading. Encourage them to share their opinions and perspectives.
- 8. Collaborative Projects: Encourage siblings or friends to work together on a project, fostering teamwork and cooperation.

By encouraging communication in different forms, we support our children in expressing their ideas confidently and respecting the ideas of others.




