



WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING

The children have enjoyed another week of engaging activities where they have been able to learn and communicate with each other.

Respectful Behaviours in the School Community

Positive school environments are important because everyone has the right to be safe. Everyone at school, particularly staff and parents/carers, play a role in making school a better place for learning and work.

Schools are positive places of learning, but schools are also workplaces, and school staff deserve to work in an environment where they don't feel threatened or unsafe.

Unacceptable behaviours include:

- Being violent or threatening violence
- Speaking or behaving in a rude, aggressive or threatening way in person, via email or over the phone
- Sending demanding, rude or confronting letters, emails or text messages
 If parents or community members behave in an unacceptable way there may be consequences such as a <u>School Community Safety Order</u> to limit harmful or threatening behaviours. Be a good role model for your child.

Mobile Devices

All phones bought to school must be switched off and given to teachers for safe keeping.

This includes any device that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as a smart watch.

Smart watches must have their internet connectivity switched off during school times.

When a student is not complying with this mobile phone policy, we will be required to follow a process in line with our existing student engagement policies.

Our Breakfast Club is open on Tuesday and Thursday from 8:30 am at the Canteen.


