#### **School Opinion Survey**

#### **Peaceful Kids Program**

As you may have seen over the past couple of weeks in our newsletters, in Term 4, we are excited to be starting the program 'Peaceful Kids'. Peaceful Kids is a wellbeing program with a focus on mindfulness and positive psychology. The program is run by Lisa Webber, an experienced Primary School Teacher. She has been a Peaceful Kids Facilitator since 2019 and is also an Art Therapist. Her passion for children, education and wellbeing has led her to teaching children about mindfulness and how important it is to look after their mental health. As a mum of 4 young children, Lisa understands the importance of giving children the knowledge and power to regulate their emotions and to be able to help themselves (or ask for help) when in times of stress or uncertainty. Students from Foundation - Year 6 can enrol in the program, which consists of one 50 minute session each week for 8 weeks.

#### **IB-PYP Consultant Visit**

As a PYP candidate school, we work closely with the International Baccalaureate Consultancy Team to refine our processes and the way we teach to align with the PYP program. This week, Mr Gammon spent two jam-packed days with Marcia, our PYP consultant, talking with teachers and students, and reviewing our Program of Inquiry and the PYP implementation at KGPS. It was such a fantastic opportunity for our teachers to ask questions and our students to share their learning. For those new to our school, this short video shows a small glimpse into the Primary Years Program.

#### **School Uniform**

As the term has progressed, we have noticed a range of non-uniform items being worn throughout the school. It is important to note that our school uniform policy, which was developed by our School Council in close consultation with our school community, aims to foster a sense of community and belonging. It also reduces student competition on the basis of clothing and enhances the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.




