were awarded with prizes for fantastic teamwork and the successful completion of the experiment. This visit aligns closely with the 5/6 learning community central idea which is 'Technological advancements influence the way people live'.

2023 Planning

Planning for 2023 is now well underway, including the process of compiling our 18 classes. Teachers and school leaders have commenced this complex and carefully planned process, aiming to have all classes finalised by late November. The amount of planning and discussion teachers dedicate to the task of compiling classes is greatly appreciated as they use their professional judgment and knowledge of students and families in forming the classes for the following year.

Whilst we continue to create Home Groups (classes), it is important to highlight that students spend a considerable amount of time working with students outside their immediate class group and across each level, as we fully utilize our flexible teaching spaces, learning and teaching collaboratively across the school.

No longer attending KGPS for 2023?

If you are moving schools next year, please contact the school or your child's classroom teacher as soon as possible. This allows us to create balance grades for next year and organise student transfers.

2023 School Structure (numbers current as at 17th Nov & may change)

School growth and class sizes

Overall, the school size will increase from 342 to approximately 390 students (based on current figures), of 16 to 18 classes; and an average class size across the whole school of approximately 21 students per class.

Further information, including 2023 class teachers, will be published in the newsletter in approximately 2 weeks.

Compiling 2022 classes

Sometimes a small number of parents submit feedback and special requests regarding class placement. These requests are certainly considered, up to **Friday 25th November**, but cannot always be acted upon.

As part of the process, **students are also asked to list several friends** with whom they would like to be with, with the intention that they are with at least one of these friends. Accordingly, **it is important to emphasize that parent requests for placement of a child with specific named friends cannot be considered**, based on the complexity of the process overall and our inability to abide by potentially contradictory requests from families.

2023 classes- 'Up Days' (Prep-Year 5 transition)

Our first 'Up Day' sessions is scheduled for the morning of December 6th. During this session students will visit their 2023 Learning Community and will meet some of the teachers who will be teaching in their Learning Community. Our second 'Up Day' will be on **Friday 16th December**, providing an opportunity for students to meet their new teacher, (where possible) and be with their new classmates in their future classroom space.

Farewells & New Staff

As with all schools, staffing changes will occur as our school grows. These details will be provided in the coming weeks.

End of year dates

On Friday 16th December we will hold our final assembly for the year at 2:45pm. The Up Day session is scheduled for the morning session on this day.

Monday 19th December will be our clean-up day. Attendance on this day is optional.

Tuesday 20th December is a Student-Free day. On this day teachers will be forward planning for 2023.

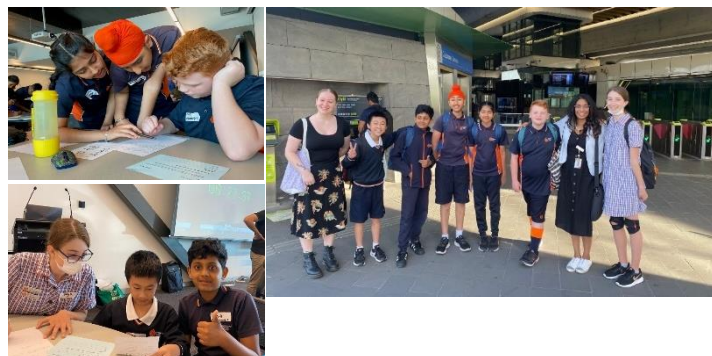
