# #3 Transdisciplinary Themes: A Holistic Approach to Education

One of the key aspects of the PYP that sets it apart from traditional educational approaches is its focus on transdisciplinary themes. These six themes provide the framework for a wide range of engaging, relevant, challenging, and significant inquiries:

- 1. Who we are
- 2. Where we are in place and time
- 3. How we express ourselves
- 4. How the world works
- 5. How we organise ourselves
- 6. Sharing the planet

Each theme is addressed each year through Units of Inquiry, which integrate traditional subjects such as math, science, and language arts. For instance, while exploring the theme "How the world works," students might learn about scientific principles, geography, and cultural perspectives on the natural world, all in an interconnected way.

By linking subject areas, the transdisciplinary approach provides a more realistic, relevant, and comprehensive understanding of the world, helping students make connections between their learning and the real world. In the PYP, the learning journey is not confined to separate subjects but is seen as an interwoven tapestry of knowledge, skills, and understanding.

# SUPPORTING THE LEARNER PROFILE AT HOME

# Developing Knowledgeable Students at Home

This week's Learner Profile attribute is "Knowledgeable." A knowledgeable student explores concepts, ideas, and issues that have local and global significance, gaining indepth knowledge and developing understanding across a broad range of subjects.

Below are some activities that you can take part in with your child/ren to help develop their understanding of being knowledgeable.

- 1. Fact of the Day: Share an interesting fact with your child each day. Encourage them to share a fact they have learned too.
- 2. Map Exploration: Explore a map or globe with your child. Talk about different countries, their cultures, and landmarks.
- 3. Animal Cards: Make simple flashcards of different animals. Talk about their habitats, food, and characteristics.
- 4. Storytelling: Use storybooks to introduce new ideas and issues. Discuss these with your child.
- 5. Virtual Museum Tours: Take virtual tours of museums around the world. Discuss the exhibitions and their significance.
- 6. Book Club: Start a family book club. Read the same book and discuss it together.
- 7. Global Cuisine: Cook a meal from a different culture. Research the country, its customs and traditions.
- 8. Current Events: Discuss a current event. Encourage your child to express their understanding and viewpoint.

By engaging in these activities, we can encourage our children to become knowledgeable learners, equipped to understand and navigate the world around them.








# STEM

In Term 4, we are excited to be starting the program 'Peaceful Kids'. Peaceful Kids is a wellbeing program with a focus on mindfulness and positive psychology. The program is run by Lisa Webber, an experienced Primary School Teacher. She has been a Peaceful Kids Facilitator since 2019 and is also an Art Therapist.
